
Call for book donations to Alphabet Soup Madiba Annual Book Drive

Alphabet Soup assisted in the donation of books to Touch Africa's Libraries, which are constructed out of refurbished shipping containers and are fitted with air conditioning, wooden laminated floors, beautiful shelving, a blackboard, tables and chairs, as well as +2,500 books.
