Agri BIZNIZ Summit to address agricultural needs

The types of products that will be showcased include agricultural machinery and commercial vehicles, irrigation equipment, research organisations, financial services, chemical products, livestock, dairy equipment, IT technology and animal health products.

As a result of the show's phenomenal success, AFWE events will be hosted in three additional provinces this year - KwaZulu-Natal, Limpopo and the North West - with the same objectives.
