

# New voices and talent for Good Hope FM

She will be joined by two radio newcomers: newsreader Roxanne Bennett, a former KTV presenter and now a student at the University of Cape Town, and sports presenter Taryn Oliver. The third newcomer is 19-year-old newsreader, Vrishni Pillay, on Bradley Knight's and Tyrone Paulsen's weekend shows.

Completing the weekend line-up are regulars Tyrone Paulsen, the popular Nightwatchmen, and Eeshaam September, who will continue to keep Cape Town in touch with what's happening in the city.
