

Electricity to cost 9.6% more from 1 April

Electricity tariffs will increase by 9.6% from 1 April for Eskom customers and from 1 July for municipal customers. Eskom had initially applied to the National Energy Regulator of South Africa (Nersa) for a 20.5% tariff increase last year.

Nersa had to make its decision on Eskom's application by 25 February, the High Court ruled late last year, following a dispute between the two parties.

In response to Nersa's decision, Calib Cassim, Eskom's chief financial officer, said: "The financial implications of this decision on Eskom's long-term sustainability will need to be further understood. It is understood that Nersa considered the impact on consumers and the financial sustainability of Eskom as it made its decision".
