

## Integrated policy approach needed to ensure sustainable food systems

New recommendations on the role of sustainable forestry in achieving food security and nutrition for all have been endorsed during the 44th Session of the Committee on World Food Security (CFS) - *Making a Difference in Food Security and Nutrition*. Tenure of land and other resources were also highlighted as key in the recommended approach, and the committee acknowledged the greater role that the CFS Voluntary Guidelines on Tenure could play.

The recommendations centred on the need for an integrated policy approach to forestry, agriculture, water and food security and nutrition by reinforcing cross-sectoral coordination.

## **Urbanisation and rural development**

CFS also discussed urbanisation and rural development and offered a platform for stakeholders to work together and steer away from approaching urbanisation and rural development as separate sectors as has been the case in the recent past. This is especially pertinent in a context of an increasingly urbanised world and changing food systems. The number of people living in cities is to rise from 50 percent to 66 percent by 2050.

Over the next two years, the committee will explore the impact of urbanisation on people with lower income and on furthering youth's and women's engagement and employment in food systems, including linking producers to markets.

## Overhauling the world's food systems

The plenary session kicked off on Monday with FAO's call for new food systems to conquer malnutrition in all its forms. FAO Director-General Jose Graziano da Silva told delegates that "more active policies" are needed to ensure sustainable
