

The Architects' Gallery is a showcase of some of the country's finest architectural projects. This year, however, the introduction of a three-dimensional immersive element will bring each of the buildings in the gallery to life.

Once Again, the show's restaurant will be a focal point and an immersive space where design, architecture and food converge.
