The **2019 National Small Business Champion** went to Andrew Maren from ProfitShare Partners. Maren is democratising access to finance for SMEs. He has proved with his disruptive fintech funding business that they can include unbankable SMEs in the economy with limited funding risks.



The **2019 National Entrepreneur Champion** went to Virosh Singh from Construction For Africa. Singh's dream and vision was to make Construction for Africa a stable and ongoing business, but the greatest challenge he had was creating the infrastructure and getting the business to grow without any cash flow, working capital or clients. These challenges were overcome in due time by creating a demand for their services, being better than their opposition, being disciplined in
